OUR YEAR IN REVIEW

During 2025-2026, the Council has delivered a range of projects and services for the benefit of our parish residents.

- Installation of bus shelter at Filham in partnership with Devon County Council
- Repair of the wall bordering the Burial Ground
- Refurbishment of the conduit in Ugborough Square and repair of the light
- Maintenance of the Bittaford Play Area including a tree survey and tree works
- Review of Burial Ground procedures and record management
- Purchase of a bookcase in Ugborough Bus shelter for the book swap
- Re-surfacing works on Donkey Lane footpath
- Local Government Review consultation
- Provision of speed warning signs in Bittaford and Filham
- Grant of £2,960 received from Devon County Council to support improvements and repairs to public footpaths
