Friday 26th June in Ugborough Village Hall –

Free screening of the People's Emergency Briefing film, hosted by Greener Ugborough Parish.

This 45-minute film, presented by Chris Packham, brings together ten of the UK's leading experts to set out the latest evidence on climate and nature breakdown — and its implications for health, food systems, the economy and national security.

The briefing was originally shown at a major national event attended by over 1,200 invited guests, including MPs and leaders from across politics, business, faith, sport and the media. It is now being shared in communities and businesses across the UK as part of a wider effort to ensure the public can hear the evidence directly, and reflect in an informed way on the scale of the challenge ahead.

Over 100 MPs and Lords now support the call for a televised national emergency briefing, recognising the importance of clear, transparent communication with the public on these issues. This screening is part of that wider conversation.

Bringing the film to Ugborough gives us a valuable opportunity to watch it locally and come together as a community to reflect and discuss what it means for us here.

The evening will be informal and welcoming, with time for conversation after the film. There is no charge, and all are very welcome. The film is recommended for ages 16+

Beryl's Bookworms – Sharon Hughes

The Pull of the Stars by Emma Donoghue -

Do you like medical gore and in particular the harsh reality of labour and birth during the period of WW1 ? If yes read on but if not avoid this book like the plague or should I say the Spanish flu, which was killing many more than the war itself and features heavily in this book.



Donoghue transports and lands you into a maternity/fever ward in Dublin 1918 where, with a naive young helper from a Magdalene orphanage, she tries to save lives with very basic equipment and little support from Doctors.

Julia, the nurse, prays that it will be the female Dr that does eventually come to help on the ward and not the male ones who pay little heed to the torture and lifelong injury they allow women to suffer, in order to ensure they can please their husbands and have more children, ideally 12!

The female Doctor turns out to be based on the only real-life character - Dr Lynn a suffragette and Sinn Fein activist, who , as conveyed in the book, makes groundbreaking steps for women in and out of the hospital.

The young helper in the book , Bridie, comes from one of the notorious Magdalene laundry/orphanages and her naivety and the abuse she has suffered is believably portrayed.

The book is all wrapped up with an off the ward night of passion (no further spoilers) which it seems the 90,000 plus Goodread raters and our 10 book group members present found completely unnecessary. We could only think Donoghue had thrown this in to make the appeal of the book wider and to balance the graphic medical stuff!

Our overall score was just over 3/5 with an appreciation of the detail of the writing and some enjoyment, but a disappointment of the ending and for some a real annoyance at Donoghue's deliberate lack of quotation marks!

Our next read is The Names by Florence Knapp.

Ceilidh at Buckfastleigh Town Hall:

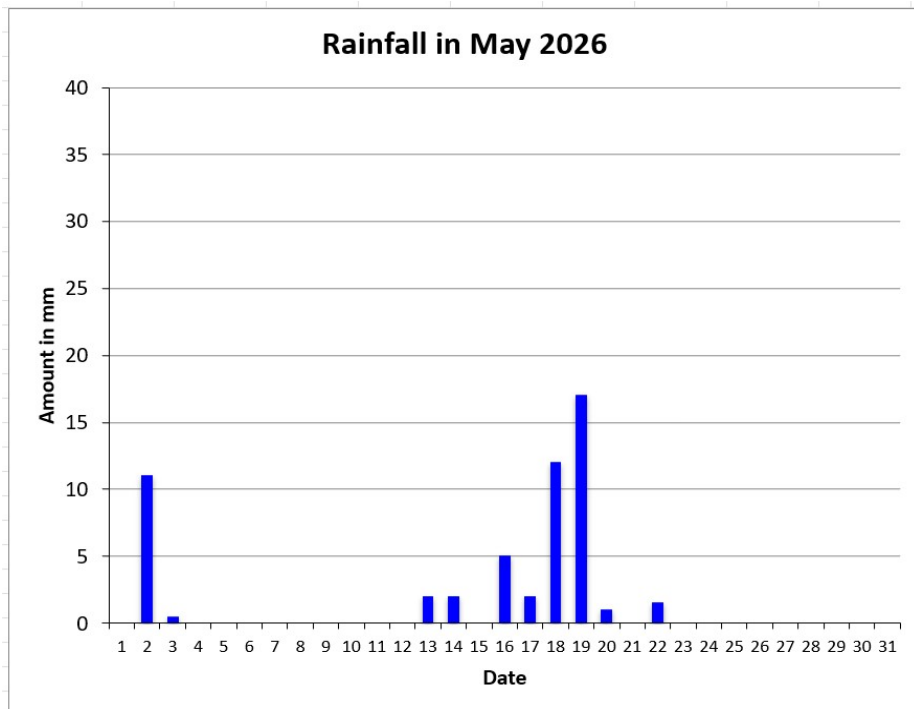

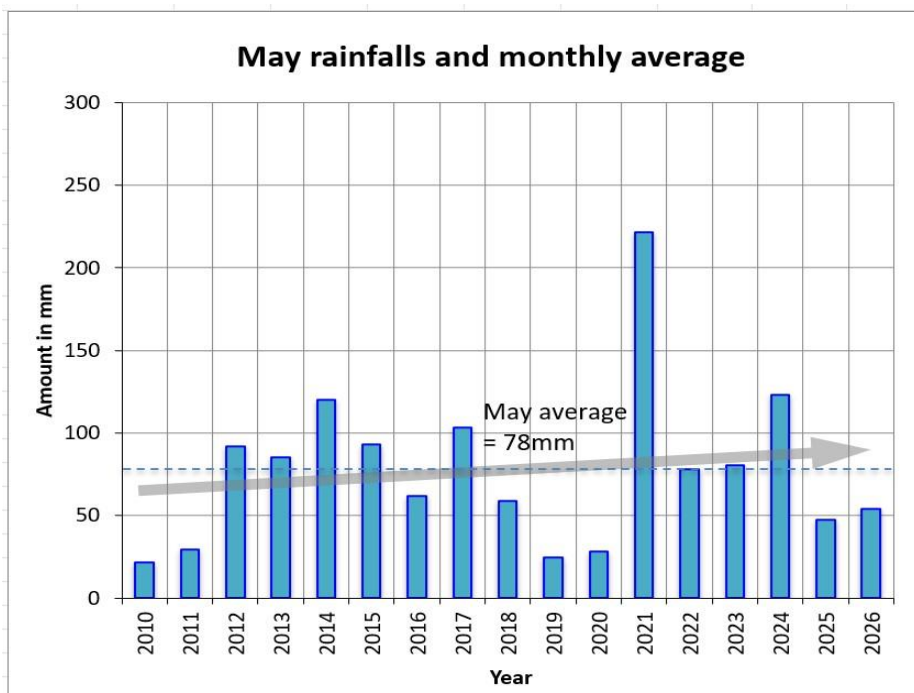
Ugborough Chair Exercise Class -Peter and Ann Povey

Ugborough Parish Council News from our June Meeting.

No members of the public attended the meeting.

Questions from the Public and Matters Arising

1. A member of the public has reported that the hedge bordering the Church Yard in Ugborough is overgrown. Our clerk will confirm whether this is the responsibility of South Hams District Council who look after the graveyard and, if so, request that they do some maintenance on it.
2. Cllr May is communicating with DCC regarding the recent cutting of the verge and wildflowers on the B3213 from Bittaford to Filham during “No Mow May.”
3. We would like to thank the School Playing Field Committee for providing and installing two new goals in the School Field public play area.

4. Our clerk is currently seeking permission from the management company for the Lucerne Fields Estate for us to purchase and install a new bench on one of the grass areas.

5. We are pleased to see that the hedge on Ugborough Road, Bittaford has been cut.

6. The date for the autumn defibrillator training is being changed – new date to be confirmed.

Reports from Devon County Council and South Hams District Council Councillors

Cllrs Dan Thomas (DCC), Alison DeWynter (SHDC), and Vic Abbott (DCC and SHDC) had sent their apologies. The report from Cllr Thomas is available on our website.

Planning

We considered 3 planning applications:

a) Certificate of Lawfulness for existing use of building as C3 dwelling, Newbrook, Ugborough

Our response to SHDC: Council is unable to provide evidence to support or refute the claim but believe the property has been lived in for a period of time. Council request that SHDC check all building regulations have been complied with.

b) Trees (TPO): 5 Moor Park, Moorhaven.

We supported the application to carry out works to tree(s) at 5 Moor Park, Moorhaven, protected by a Tree Preservation Order.

c) Application for modification of Section 106 Agreement. Lutterburn Farm, Lutterburn Street, Ugborough.

Our response to SHDC: Object. Council support compliance with the original condition regarding the provision of affordable housing and proposes that the developer adjusts the asking price of the properties to reflect the affordable housing market in this area. Council also request that improvement is made to the advertising of the affordable plots.

Finance

We are happy to fund up to £100 for the planting around the Ugborough War Memorial from the Community Projects and Support reserve.

As advised by our internal auditor we now have a grant funding policy which can be found on our website. If anyone wishes to apply for grant funding from us, please use the application form on the website or email our clerk and request a word version of the form.

Assets and Maintenance

The grant application submitted for S106 funding towards the refurbishment of Bittaford Play Area is progressing through the system. Meantime we have decided to proceed with the hedge and footpath maintenance work. As soon as we know the dates the work will take place we will post on social media – we hope there will be as little disruption as possible.

We still hope to have the play equipment installed in time for the school summer holidays but do need to wait for confirmation of the grant.
